CIWA – Resource Guide overview

- CIWA's vision is to empower immigrant women and enrich Canadian society.
- Their core service areas are settlement and integration, language training and childcare, employment, and family and business services.
- Language Training provides language classes to clients to help them achieve English proficiency. Childcare is provided for the student's children.
- They have 2 LINC Special Needs classes for clients with physical and intellectual disabilities.

Easter Seals Alberta

- Easter Seals Alberta provides services for people with disabilities and medical conditions.
- Their 3 agency pillars are Accessibility Supports, Camp Horizon, and the McQueen Resistance.
- With their equipment loan program, they provide equipment to people with disabilities. If a client isn't qualified to get something covered through ADL, they might qualify for this program. This is aimed to increase independence and relieve caregiver burden.
- Have 2 scholarships. The Supporting Students Through Accessible Technology and Mentorship program is open to students entering or in high school that have a disability, this provides \$1000 per student. The Phyllis Davidson scholarship is for post-secondary students with physical disabilities that provide up to \$5000 per school year.
- Camp Horizon does have a cost, but it is heavily subsidized up to 100%, it is based on financial need. Registration is currently closed but it opens every February
